Data Privacy Notice

This privacy notice outlines our commitment to keeping your data safe and secure and explains how we collect and process your data.

1. What is Personal Data?

'Personal data' means information that identifies a living person. This could include a person's name, address, phone number or email address.

'Personal data' also means any personal information you provide to us. This may be by phone, text message (SMS), email, social media, letter and other correspondence, and in person. It can include IP addresses and other technical identifying information.

2. How we collect personal data

We may collect personal data directly from you during our interactions with you. For example, when you:

4. The personal information we collect

Examples of the information we may collect include:

All personal data is kept on a password protected laptop or in a secure password protected cloud and is not stored or transported on portable electronic devices such as memory sticks.

7. How long do we keep your data?

We will only keep your personal information for as long as it is necessary to provide the services and/or products that you have requested, or for essential purposes such as, complying with our legal obligations, resolving disputes, investigating disciplinary matters and enforcing our agreements.

8. How we use Web Analytics and Cookies

When someone visits <u>www.laurahamiltonconsulting.com</u> we use third party services from SquareSpace and Google Analytics, to collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns. The information about how you use our website is processed in a way which does not identify you as an individual. Google Analytics transmits website traffic data to Google servers in the United States. Google Analytics does not identify individual users or associate your IP address with any other data help by Google. We use reports provided by Google Analytics to help us understand website traffic and webpage usage. We do not make, and do not allow SquareSpace or Google Analytics to make, any attempt to find out the identities of those visiting our website. If we do want to collect personally identifiable information through our website, we will always be up front about this and clearly ask for your consent. We will make it clear when we collect personal information and will always explain what we intend to do with it.

We use cookies to provide you with a better service. Cookies are pieces of information a website transfers to your computer's hard disk for record-keeping purposes. Cookies can make the Web more useful by storing information about your preferences for a particular site.

Cookies in and of themselves do not personally identify users, although they do identify a user's computer. Most browsers are initially set to accept cookies. If you prefer, you can set your browser to refuse cookies.

9. Your rights and personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data:

- the right to request a copy of your personal data which Laura Hamilton Consulting holds about you
- the right to request that Laura Hamilton Consulting corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- the right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for Laura Hamilton Consulting to retain such data
- the right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- the right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with their personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability)
- the right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing
- the right to object to the processing of personal data
- the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office (<u>www.ico.org.uk</u>)
